## John 4:13-14

The story of Jesus meeting the women at the well is often spoken of in the Church. It is a story that is told over and over, why is that because it is told to tell us that we are to serve where we are at. It has been said that Jesus must needs, and that we must needs as well. We are shown how Jesus knew the Women and her past life and still talked with her. How that the Samaritans were the outcast and that we need to go to the outcast but there is something that I believe is overlooked. It is a important yet simple set of words contained in this lesson. Drinketh of this water. You see Jesus gave the women a choice... Keep doing what you have always done or come to me and I will give you water of everlasting life.

## John 4:13-14 KJV

- 13 Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again:
- 14 But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life.
- I. Vs 13 ...of this water...
  - a. Thing of the world don't last. Matthew 6:19
  - b. Things of the world are temporal
    - i. The Prodigal Son- Luke 15:11-32
    - ii. Lot and his Choice- Gen 13
- II. Vs 13...shall thirst again...
  - a. Jesus says it clear as he can. You get immersed in the World and it leaves you wanting for more.
    - i. David lies with Bathsheba led to many many lies.
    - ii. Samson eyes were on the world and it cost him his eyes.
  - b. Rich man and Lazarus He asked for one more drop of water. When he lived "he had it all" yet he asked for more
- III. Water (life) from Christ is complete vs. 14 says ... shall never thirst...
  - a. We are sealed in Him.
  - b. He is the everlasting life.
